Active Reading Habits

- 1. Figure out 3- and 4-syllable words familiar from everyday speech, including names.
- 2. Try different sounds for the letters or chunks in a new word until you recognize the word.
- 3. Use prefixes and suffixes to figure out words (un-, re-, mis-, -ful, -able, -tion, -ly, -ier, -iest).
- 4. Stop and self-correct when something doesn't look right, sound right, or make sense.
- 5. Visualize as you read books with few or no illustrations.
- 6. Read fluently and with expression, using punctuation.
- 7. Read silently for at least 30 minutes without getting tired.
- 8. Read at home for at least 30 minutes every night.
- 9. Finish a 2R chapter book every week.
- 10. Find a favorite chapter book series and read them all.
- 11. Read fiction, nonfiction, poetry, fables, and folktales.

- Retell the story in 3 sentences: In the beginning... In the middle... In the end...
- 2. Describe the main characters. How do they react to events in the story?
- 3. Describe the setting, where and when the story takes place.
- 4. Read a good part out loud, using different voices for different characters.
- 5. What is the lesson or moral of this story? How do you know?

 - the whole text
 - one paragraph or page
- 2. What did you learn from your reading?
- 3. What questions do you have?
- 4. What text features does your book have for finding information quickly? Show how you can use them.
- 5. Why do you think the author wrote this book? What was the most important thing s/ he wanted us to learn?
