



Pygmy Owls- 1st Grade

Can you believe it's almost time for Report Cards? Have you already made your account on MyStudent? That's how you will be able to view progress reports, reports, and pay for field trips when they come up.

Your child should be reading nightly to help grow them as readers. This can include many different types of media. Paper books, online books from RAZ-kids or the Bookshelf App, magazines, library books, etc. Be sure to record the minutes they read at home on their homework sheet. They get a reading step for every 15 minutes they read at home. Our goal is for every child to reach 100 steps. Last year we even had students make it to 200! Beginning in mid-Nov. the benchmark is for all students to be reading at a 1B level. Reading at home and practicing *Power Words* nightly can help your child get there.

In Math, we our finishing up our 1st Module and will begin Module 2 on Addition and Subtraction within 20 using Place Value. Many of the students now have Zearn accounts which help them practice their math skills on the computer. If they have an account it can be used at home as well as school. Practicing fact fluency at home is also important *i.e.*: 2+8=, 5+5=.

Eagle Owls- 2nd Grade

Things are *FALLING* into place on the Eagle Owls team! Routines have been established for independent reading in class. Reading every night with your child will be a great benefit to them.

We are participating in READING STEPS this year. For every 15 minutes your child reads at home, he/she will be awarded a Step on a chart in the room. Our goal is to have the children read 100 STEPS by the end of the school year. Please continue to record any reading at home in their planners. We appreciate your involvement. Looking back in the text to find answers to questions has been a focus during reading.

Our Eureka math lessons have been about understanding place value units of one, ten, and a hundred. We will move forward by counting within 1,000; skip counting by fives, tens, and 100s. During science class, lessons have been centered around the human body systems and their function and life cycles of plants and butterflies. Thank you for all you do to support us at school!

Snowy Owls- 3rd Grade

Our Snowy Owls are soaring into second quarter!

In Math, our students are working on problem solving strategies that include time, measurement, and rounding to the nearest tens and hundreds. Our students are expected to read and understand word problems and then be able to solve them using addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division strategies. *Khan Academy* is a great place to practice these skills more online! Please continue to work on *FasttMath* for fact fluency!

In Language Arts, our students are starting a Folk Tale unit where they are studying the similarities and differences between fables, legends, fairy tales, tall tales, myths, porquoi and trickster tales. We are working to understand main idea and key details, comparing and contrasting, and asking and answering questions about a text. We are also beginning to write to writing prompts and reviewing editing marks and how to make our writing better. Please continue to support your child's reading growth by reading nightly at home and working on reading goals. *Book Taco, ReadTheory*, and *RazKids* include reading comprehension practice for your growing reader!

In Science and Social Studies, we are wrapping up our units on *Classifying Plants and Animals* and have even started planting some of our own flowering plants! We will be starting a new unit on matter and how matter changes. In Social Studies, we are continuing to build our map skills by looking at the cultural geography of our world, continent, and country.

Spotted Owls- 4th Grade

Happy Fall Y'all! In 4th grade, we have completed our first round of Quarterly Assessments. This is a great tool for teachers to use to guide instruction for the next quarter. Students take Quarterly Assessments in Reading, Writing, Math and Science at the end of every quarter.

There is a teacher planning day (no school for students) on October 15th. On October 18th there is a field trip to see the Florida Orchestra at Wesley Chapel High School. We have our Spotted Fall celebration on November 2nd please look for messages/flyers from teachers to donate some goodies!

In math we are in Module 3, focusing on multiplication, division, and multi-step word problems. FasttMath accounts have been made for every student. To access this program, go to the wges.pasco.k12.fl.us and find the link on Kids Corner. Students' username and password is their student number. Khan Academy is another great resource for students to have extra practice that aligns with Eureka.

In ELA, we are wrapping up informational texts for this quarter and will be ready for literary texts. In writing, students will start learning about opinion writing.
